Westminster Larger Catechism Q & A 70, 71

<u>Leader</u>: What is justification?

People: Justification is an act of God's free grace to sinners, in which he pardons all their sins and accepts and accounts their whole persons as righteous in his sight, not for anything worked into them or done by them, but only because of the perfect obedience and full satisfaction of Christ imputed to them by God, received by faith alone.

<u>Leader</u>: How is justification an act of God's free grace?

People: Although Christ, by his obedience and death, made a proper, real, and full satisfaction to God's justice on behalf of those who are justified, yet because God accepts this satisfaction for a payment which he might have demanded of them; provided this payment himself, through his own only Son imputing his righteousness to them; and requires nothing from them for their justification except faith, which is also his gift; therefore their justification is of free grace.
